Sun (Surya)

- Considered a symbol of the soul, representing the core essence of an individual
- Significance of one's sense of self, ego, and individuality
- Placement of sun in our birth chart indicates a person's natural inclinations, vitality, leadership abilities, and how they express themselves
- Associated with the father figure, authority, and one's pursuit of recognition and success

Moon (Chandra):

- Represents the mind, emotions, and the subconscious
- Reflects our emotional nature, intuition and feelings
- Placement of the moon in our birth chart indicates how a person reacts emotionally to situations, their needs for comfort and security, and their nurturing qualities
- Associated with the mother figure, and the capacity for learning and our domestic life

Mercury (Budha):

- Symbolizes communication, intellect, and analytical thinking
- Influences how a person processes information, learns, and expresses themselves verbally and in writing
- Placement reveals one's communication style, adaptability, and capacity for learning and critical thinking

Venus (Shukra):

- Associated with love, beauty, creativity, and sensual pleasures
- Governs romantic relationships, artistic endeavors, and a person's sense of aesthetics
- Placement indicates how one forms relationships, social skills, and their appreciation for art & beauty

Mars (Mangala):

- Represents energy, action, courage, and assertiveness
- Influences how a person takes initiative, faces challenges, and expresses their desires
- Placement reveals one's drive, ambition, and approach to conflict and competition

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Jupiter (Guru):

- Symbolizes wisdom, knowledge, expansion, and growth
- Governs spiritual pursuits, higher education, and philosophical beliefs
- Placement indicates a person's moral values, faith, and capacity for personal and spiritual growth

Saturn (Shani):

- Associated with discipline, responsibility, limitations, and challenges

Rahu and Ketu:

- These are Lunar nodes are considered shadow planets
- Represent karmic influences, desires, and challenges from past lives
- Rahu represents desires and ambitions while Ketu represents spiritual growth and detachment
